### World Communion Sunday



Edinboro Presbyterian Church October 2 will join with millions of Christians in thousands of places, using hundreds of local bread recipes and dozens of languages, all to demonstrate our commitment to Christian unity and Christ-centered discipleship. The first Sunday of October is observed as World Communion Sunday across [many congregations and denominations](#), as the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper becomes a visible indication of how vast Christ's church is. You are invited to participate with us at FUPC Sunday morning at 11:00 a.m.

Obviously, not all Christians observe World Communion Sunday, but this likely *is* the largest celebration of Communion across the world and its time zones each year. The occasion's [history](#) has Pennsylvania and Presbyterian roots dating back to 1933. It saw widespread growth during and in the aftermath of World War II, as Christ's followers in many places needed familiar and new signs of hope.

In the Presbyterian Church, this Sacrament is open to all people who love Jesus and who want to love the Lord more, regardless of church membership status. When a family decides children can understand the significance of the sharing of a holy meal (including its joy and fellowship), appropriate to the child's age and maturity level, young people are welcomed to receive the bread and the cup here. The congregation has the privilege and responsibility of guiding children in their faithful participation.

## Spuds-n-Suds Luncheon is October 23

FUPC's annual "Spuds-n-Suds" is back this month. Our Deacons and Fellowship Team will be creating our traditional baked potato bar (the "Spuds" part) and serving up creamy root beer (our version of the "Suds"). Join us – and invite a friend or two – after the 11:00 worship service on October 23.

This is the annual fundraiser for our Deacons Fund, which support a variety of our mission and outreach ministries throughout the year. Your donations beyond our cost for the groceries will be used to fund local mission projects which help our neighbors in need, to connect with our older and less active members, and to buy and repair medical equipment for our community loaner program.

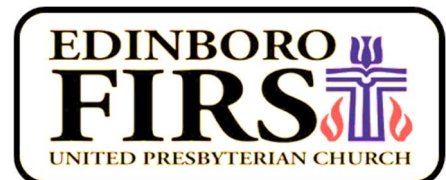

## From the Pastor

# God's new and renewed calling for me, for all of you, and for us

It is with mixed emotions, great hope, and heartfelt thanks that I shared my big news with this congregation the past weekend. After more than five years as your pastor, I will be moving on to a new God-inspired calling which combines my talents and experience from my first-career work as a radio broadcaster with the service and skills I have developed across 27 years of teaching/leading ministry since my ordination as clergy. Starting next month, I will join the on-air staff of Family Life Radio, meaning a relocation to the Finger Lakes area of south-central New York State. It is a tremendous opportunity.

It has also been a tremendous opportunity to be your pastor. I have made good friends here, in the congregation, in the region, and in our presbytery. I have been honored to be with you in classes and worship events, at weddings and funerals, in your s

homes and at long (and short) meetings. I do not leave out of angst or anger or disappointment, nor at the nudging of anyone else – except, of course, at the leading of our Lord and Savior. Even though this five-year period has seen probably four distinct flavors, you and I have sought to be faithful and open and nimble through it all: a season when I was your in-between pastor after Matt Falco's new calling; the early days of this installed pastorate; the unprecedented season of change and limitations as lockdowns followed the start of Covid; and now as we are regrouping, learning and reorienting as post-Covid opportunities are opened to us. I am truly grateful for all the strengths of this church, your flexibility, and the kind and wise spiritual folks who welcomed me into this segment of my life's journey.

I will not repeat here all the information I shared in my original letter last weekend, but I trust you will peruse it (again) from your inbox, your mailbox or the church website. I do want to lay out a few key points to reassure you about what will change in coming weeks, affirm the ways God's calling for *your* new chapter can be vibrant and enlivening, and answer some questions about uniqueness of the Presbyterian process.

- I will continue to fully be your pastor through these four Sundays of transition, including October 16 which I anticipate will be my final Sunday leading worship. (That date is proposed, but cannot become official until action by our local Session and the regional Presbytery's Committee on Ministry [COM].)
- There will be a congregational business meeting soon, to act concurring (or not) with my request to conclude our pastorate. Our Session has already endorsed this, but the schedule is tentative until a guest moderator from the Presbytery is arranged. That date and agenda will be publicized when it is ready.
- COM folks will meet with our elders October 13 (and on other occasions) to help arrange for immediate short-term and mid-range ministries. You will still worship. You will continue to care for each other in good times and hard moments. Events and relationships which are core to this church's life will roll along.
- Following the official closing date of my pastorate, you and I will follow the "separation ethics" standards required by the Presbytery. These, honestly, are not harsh rules thrust upon a church in transition, but are healthy guidelines which demarcate the beginning and end of a pastor/congregation relationship. The return of a former pastor for too much, too soon, or for the wrong things could make it harder for your next church leaders to function well, gain your trust, or guide you into the next new chapter. Invitations for a previous pastor to lead or share at baptisms, weddings, funerals and the like must be *initiated* by the current pastor or Session moderator. As FUPC has done before after other transitions, those standards will be communicated to you by the elders and the Presbytery. (*While I am still your pastor, you and I can talk about options for such religious rites here at Edinboro.*)

Even though my pastoral role among you comes to a conclusion, you and I can, should and *will* remain friends and prayer partners. Our faith still unites us. I look forward to watching and hearing how you and the Lord work together to strengthen the ways you serve and involve our younger generations, how you emphasize that each church event has a larger goal of enhancing relationships in-house and beyond, and how our outward mission will be the keystone of faithfulness and success, as God measures true "success".
